

## A SECOND OPPORTUNITY TO HAVE YOUR BASQUE SHEEPHERDER MEMORIALIZED

If you didn't donate money to have the names of family sheepherders memorialized on tablets next to the monument in Reno, Nevada in 1989, you have a second opportunity to do so. The *Gure Euskal Etxea* March newsletter informed you of the theft of the bronze plaques in January 2011 engraved with the names of hundreds of sheepherders who immigrated to the United States.

A list of all the names inscribed on the original plaques have been submitted to the insurance carrier from University of Nevada Reno Professor Carmelo Urza, the author of "Solitude," a book about the monument that contains the names. Urza said he recently spoke with acclaimed Basque artist Nestor Basterretxea, who designed the 22-foot bronze statue that is the monument centerpiece. Basterretxea suggested creating new plagues with a material other than bronze, which would be less valuable to vandals. Police suspect that the tablets were torn off a wall with pry bars so that they could be sold to recyclers. No arrests have been made. "Nestor was thinking that he might be able to use a matte stainless steel that could look very modern and very interesting and not have the same material value on the wall," said Urza, a member of the project's original organizing committee. Urza said he has been recently contacted by Basque families who would like to have names added to the tablets when new ones go up. These supporters can now acknowledge loved ones and help the revitalization effort by making a donation, Urza said. The money would be used to offset costs not covered by the insurance, such as replacing four interactive sign posts designed to guide visitors. Designs for the posts, which feature new text and art, have already been created, according to Urza. Those interested in contributing can contact
